

# SECONDHAND SMOKE & YOUR PET

There is no safe level of exposure to secondhand smoke.



Dogs with long sized noses have an increased risk for **nose cancer**.



Dogs with short or medium sized noses have an increased risk for **lung cancer**.



Cats are **2X more likely** to develop Lymphoma. 5+ years of exposure increases to **3X more likely**.



Birds are at a higher risk of **lung cancer** and may experience **eyesight problems**.



Bunnies have an increased risk of **lung disease** and **heart problems**.



Secondhand smoke contains thousands of **chemicals**, at least 70 are known to **cause cancer**.
